

19th Annual

Cannon Valley Elder Collegium Spring Meeting

St. John's Hall, May 1, 2016

Continuing the format begun in 2015, the annual meeting of members was preceded by a half-hour social time, a time to greet old and new friends. After the social time, Board Chair Jerry Mohrig welcomed the roughly 65 members present and called the annual meeting to order at 2:30 P.M. His welcome included two of the year's highlights – a record number of students enrolled in CVEC courses, twice as many as the registrations in 2004-05, and the success of the new classes in Faribault.

Upon being seated, each member received a handout containing the meeting agenda; a brief introduction to Stephen Kelly, who was to be nominated to serve for the first time as a Board member; a list of films and instructors scheduled for the 2016 film festival; a tentative list of titles and instructors for the fall 2016 courses; and a financial report. A copy of the handout is attached to these Minutes.

Jerry turned the meeting over to Executive Director Rich Noer, who talked briefly and enthusiastically about the state of the Collegium. Rich said that the Collegium's course offerings and registrations have increased significantly. Currently, CVEC offers twelve or more courses each term, with more than 220 registrations per term and 90 first-time registrants during the 2015 – 2016 academic year. While gratifying, this has led to considerable enrollment pressure, with up to half of our courses each term this past year oversubscribed. He noted that there has been a considerable turnover of instructors: in the most recent five-year period, 21 instructors have retired from teaching and 31 new instructors have taken their places.

Next, Jerry introduced Peg Morrison, CVEC's Treasurer, and asked her to report on CVEC's financial position. Peg referred to the Financial Report in the handout. She explained that CVEC continues to operate "in the black," and that the reduction of total monetary assets over the past year was caused primarily by the investment in a new portable audio-visual unit, the AV Rover, which is being used in CVEC's classrooms at the Northfield Senior Center.

Rich asked the membership to recognize Perry Mason and Stephen Kelly, each of whom has taught five courses, Eric Nelson, who has taught ten courses, and Robert Flaten, who has taught 15 courses. A certificate of appreciation had been prepared for each of them, "suitable for framing." Then Rich spoke in praise of Robert Flaten and Hartley Clark, each of whom has announced his intention to "retire" from CVEC teaching after a brilliant career. Jerry recognized and thanked ReJean Schulte, who is retiring as a member and former Chair of the Board, and Bill Carlson and Lydia Moe, who are retiring after 10 years as members of the Curriculum Committee. The membership applauded as each of the above named instructors, Board members and committee members stood to be recognized.

Following the applause, Phil Eaves reported for the Nominating Committee. The slates of new Board member, extending Board members, Board officers and Nominating Committee members – each

as set forth in the meeting handout – were unanimously approved by vote of the members in attendance.

The featured speaker for the annual meeting was Richard Schulte, a CVEC instructor and frequent student. His speech was called “CVEC Courses and Long Term Memories,” and he spoke eloquently about how, as a student in two recent CVEC courses, he was prompted to recall memories of his own and his family’s past. Richard’s speech was in turn poignant and funny, and was particularly well received by the membership.

Finally, Jerry asked the assembled members to thank ReJean Schulte, Dale Talley, Phil Eaves and the other people who had helped make the annual meeting a success. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:40 P.M.
